

History of Basingstoke Music and Arts Festival

In the early sixties Hilda Price, Principal of the Summerbrook School of Music in Basingstoke, decided to start a music festival for her pupils. This became so successful that in 1963 its scope was widened, and the Basingstoke Music Festival was formed. The objectives were then as now to provide a platform where competitors can appear before an audience and receive a critique enabling them to improve their performance. It was competitive and marks and trophies were awarded. The first Music Festival which was open to all took place in the Community Centre which is now the Carnival Hall from 9-14 November 1964. It included Dancing, Piano, Elocution, vocal and choral. The President was Wilfred Greenhouse, then Principal of Trinity College, Chairman was Alderman F.C. Townsend, Miss Price was Secretary and there was a committee of 14. One of the Adjudicators was Keith Stent who adjudicated again for our 40th Anniversary in 2004.

John Greenwood was elected a Borough Councillor in 1968 and was appointed to represent the Council in the Festival Committee. He became Chairman in 1970. During the early years the whole Festival took place over one weekend covering piano, singing, brass, woodwind, strings, and dance. There was also a section including one act plays. This has disappeared now, but we have replaced it with a Creative Writing Section which includes play writing.

Sadly, we have lost some of our Vice-Presidents recently - Ann Blairman died January 2019. Garth George died November 2019. Brian Holman died March 2020. Jean Murphy died January 2021 and Irene Holman died April 2021 a month after celebrating her 90th birthday. We offer our condolences to their families and our thanks to our former Vice Presidents who made valuable contributions to the Festival for many years.

Paul Holmes, president between 1992 and 2002, is celebrating his 92nd birthday this September and we wish him a Happy Birthday and our thanks for his support of the Festival.

GENERAL RULES

- ELIGIBILITY Classes are open to amateurs from any area. An amateur is considered
 to be one who does not derive the main part of his income from performing or teaching
 that section of the art in which he enters the Festival. The Committee wishes to respect
 the conditions of any music, drama, or educational establishment regarding the
 freedom of its pupils to enter festivals.
- 2. **AGE** All ages must be calculated as on the date of the competition. Entrants may only enter the class appropriate to their age. For group entries, all members of the group must be within the age range of that class.
- ENTRIES We would prefer entries are made through Run My Festival by the following link: https://basingstokemusicandartsfestival.runmyfestival.net . Paper forms may be downloaded from our website. If the entry form is from a school, please state the name of the school.
- 4. An entrant may not enter more than **once on each instrument** in solo classes, although this is permitted in duet and ensemble classes.
- 5. Small classes may be combined at the discretion of the Section Secretary.
- 6. ENTRY FEES Completed entry forms together with the correct entry fee must be received by the Section Secretary by the closing date. Preferably via Run my Festival however paper entries will be accepted if necessary. Entrants will later receive a timesheet which will admit them to the room where their class is to be held. A stamped addressed envelope would be appreciated. Entry fees cannot be refunded.

Cheques must be made payable to BASINGSTOKE MUSIC FESTIVAL.

- 7. **ENQUIRIES** Please email the Section Secretary, otherwise for a written enquiry and reply, please enclose a S.A.E.
- 8. **OWN CHOICE PIECES** Details of pieces should be clearly stated on entry forms, and one copy of each piece provided for the Adjudicator. Entrants should not perform pieces they played at this Festival in 2021. A piece cannot be performed in more than one class in the same year.
- GRADED PIECES These must be from one of the approved examination boards, e.g. ABRSM, Trinity College, London and must be from the appropriate Grade for that class. Winners of Graded classes cannot enter the same Graded class in the following year.
- 10. ACCOMPANIST Entrants are asked to provide their own accompanist. A list of pianists who regularly accompany entrants for this Festival is available in the syllabus. All arrangements for accompanying must be made at the entrant's own expense. An accompaniment-only CD is permitted but entrants must provide their own equipment and an operator.
- 11. PHOTOCOPIES AND COPYRIGHT Entrants are reminded that it is illegal to reproduce copyright music without permission from the copyright owner. No responsibility for the breaking of this rule will be accepted by the Festival. Entrants must have an original copy of their music with them when they perform at the Festival.
- 12. **SPEECH AND DRAMA** To comply with the AUTHOR'S LICENCING AGREEMENT with the British and International Federation of Music Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech, own choice pieces must state TITLE, AUTHOR AND PUBLISHER on the entry form. This means the entrant does not have to obtain permission of the copyright owner to perform prose, verse, or dramatic solos. Acted scenes from plays and dramatic duologues still require the permission of the copyright owner. Copyright is now in place for 70 years after the death of the author.

Group Dramatic Activity Copyright permission for these items should be sought by entrants at the time of entry.

- 13. **TIME LIMITS** Entrants **must** observe the set time limits for their classes. Over-running may result in either disqualification, the performance being stopped and / or loss of marks.
- 14. A performance may be stopped at any time by the Adjudicator and their decision is final.
- 15. No entrant or member of the public may approach the Adjudicator's table. Certificates and remark sheets are available at the end of each session.
- 16. The Committee reserves the right to appoint additional or alternative Adjudicators, to transfer classes to other dates or to other sections, and to cancel classes which receive insufficient entries. Entry fees will be refunded if a class is cancelled due to lack of sufficient entries.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to make any final decisions other than those decided by the Adjudicator. Any complaints must be made to the Section Secretary by email or in writing.
- 18. Trophies are awarded to class winners receiving at least 85 marks and at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 19. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos of their child to be taken, then the responsible adult attending should inform the relevant Section Secretary and ensure that the child is not included in official photographs.
- 20. Entrants are advised to consider their appearance as part of their performance and to dress appropriately i.e. smart but casual.
- 21. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and on our Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents/guardians/carers and teachers of competitors under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrant to take part in the Festival. Without this consent the Festival entry cannot be accepted.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator, members, volunteers, students, or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation, or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers, and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to, and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff, and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support, and training

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to provide Safer Festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) will be appointed for each Federation Festival. For Basingstoke Music & Arts Festival this is ~ Steve Barlin: stephen.barlin@btopenworld.com
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers, including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel identify wear а badge to their roles. ΑII teachers/parents/quardians/ carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area or room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- 7. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken of their child, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.


DATA PROTECTION








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
